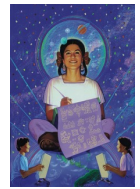

The International Latino Book Awards Celebrates The High Quality of Books By & About Latinos – Here's the 2025 Award Winning Authors By Kirk Whisler

The International Latino Book Awards, which have been produced by Empowering Latino Futures since 1998, provide great insights into the evolution of books. This year's awards, when over 5,000 books coming in it took 222 judges to review all the entries. The most common comment from these judges was how many GREAT books they were seeing in all the various 87 categories within the Awards. The book publishing industry is in the midst of evolving, like many other industries in the USA. What is very exciting is that, finally, major publishers are welcoming Latino authors and expanding their offerings in both English and Spanish. Just as exciting is that Latino and other consumers now have a lot more books available by and about Latinos in both Spanish and English.

A further sign is that there is now a consistent audience for books in both Spanish and English with a sizeable audience of 15.4 million Latino readers across the United States. These consistent readers represent 34 percent of all Latino adults and have a combined income of \$452 billion. The National Latino Reader Study's nationwide survey of 10,640 found that these readers purchase an average of 24.7 books a year, with 42 percent of the books in Spanish, a major increase from a few decades ago, when it was much harder to find a wide variety of books in Spanish in the United States.

Empowering Latino Futures takes the responsibility very meaningfully that it has working with books by and about Latinos AND in the quality of those books. That is why, in addition to recognizing the greatness of these Award-Winning Books, Honorable Mention books are also celebrated. All these books are also worth reading and enjoying.

The 27th annual International Latino Book Awards was held on October 25 at the Concert Hall on the campus of MiraCosta College in Oceanside, CA. Attending the Awards were authors from across the USA and at least 30 authors from across Latin America, Spain and elsewhere in the world. It was commented that this is the most international Latino awards show after the Latin Grammys. Special awards are named after Alma Flor Ada, Isabel Allende, Rudolfo Anaya, Nora de Hoyos Comstock, Charlie Eriksen, Juan Felipe Herrera, Dolores Huerta, Hank Lacayo, Mimi Lozano, Ambassador Julian Nava, Luis Valdez, Victor Villaseñor, and Raúl Yzaguirre. At the Awards finalists will receive a Gold, Silver, or Bronze Medal for their efforts. Los Premios Internacionales del Libro Latino Celebran la Alta Calidad de los Libros Por y Sobre Latinos – Aquí Están los Autores Ganadores del 2025 Por Kirk Whisler

Los International Latino Book Awards, producidos por Empowering Latino Futures desde 1998, ofrecen una valiosa perspectiva sobre la evolución de los libros. En la edición de este año, con más de 5.000 libros participantes, se necesitaron 222 jueces para evaluar todas las obras. El comentario más común de estos jueces fue la gran cantidad de excelentes libros que encontraron en las 87 categorías del certamen.

La industria editorial se encuentra en medio de una evolución, al igual que muchas otras industrias en Estados Unidos. Lo más emocionante es que, finalmente, las grandes editoriales están dando la bienvenida a autores latinos y ampliando su oferta tanto en inglés como en español. Igualmente alentador es que los lectores latinos y de otros orígenes ahora tienen una mayor variedad de libros disponibles, escritos por y sobre latinos, en ambos idiomas.

Otro signo positivo es que ya existe un público constante para los libros en inglés y español, con una audiencia significativa de 15,4 millones de lectores latinos en Estados Unidos. Estos lectores habituales representan el 34 por ciento de todos los adultos latinos y tienen un ingreso combinado de 452 mil millones de dólares. El National Latino Reader Study, que encuestó a 10,640 personas en todo el país, reveló que estos lectores compran en promedio 24.7 libros al año, de los cuales el 42 por ciento están en español, un aumento importante en comparación con hace algunas décadas, cuando era mucho más difícil encontrar una amplia variedad de libros en español en Estados Unidos.

Empowering Latino Futures asume con gran responsabilidad su labor de trabajar con libros por y sobre latinos, así como en garantizar la calidad de esas obras. Por eso, además de reconocer la excelencia de los libros galardonados, también se celebran los libros con Mención Honorífica. Todos estos libros merecen ser leídos y disfrutados.

La 27ª edición anual de los International Latino Book Awards se llevó a cabo el 25 de octubre en el Concert Hall del campus del MiraCosta College en Oceanside, California. Asistieron autores de todo Estados Unidos y al menos 30 autores de América Latina, España y otras partes del mundo. Se comentó que este evento es el premio latino más internacional después de los Latin Grammys.

Se otorgan premios especiales con los nombres de Alma Flor Ada, Isabel Allende, Rudolfo Anaya, Nora de Hoyos Comstock, Charlie Eriksen, Juan Felipe Herrera, Dolores Huerta, Hank Lacayo, Mimi Lozano, Embajador Julián Nava, Luis Valdez, Víctor Villaseñor y Raúl Yzaguirre.
